We are committed to helping people realize their financial dreams. It's at the heart of everything we do. In 2023, TwinStar and Eugene, Oregon-based Northwest Community Credit Union merged. By bringing together two financially strong credit unions, we continue to deliver unparalleled products and service to our 250,000+ members in Washington and Oregon.

TwinStar Credit Union started as a teachers' credit union in 1938. In the 1930s, small loans were difficult for teachers to obtain due to their low salaries and high interest rates. Dewey Noblitt, a math teacher at Olympia High School, brought together 15 teachers who started Thurston County Teacher Credit Union – and made loans easier to obtain and more affordable for its members.

Northwest Community Credit Union was started in 1949 by six friends who worked together at Weyerhaeuser Company. During lunch one day, they decided they wanted to help each other, so they put \$50 dollars in a lunchbox. Later that year, the Weyerhaeuser Springfield Federal Credit Union made its first loan.

Throughout both credit unions' histories, they have prided themselves on providing amazing service to their members and helping their local communities thrive. Now as one combined organization, we look forward to making an even greater impact in the decades to come.

2023 Giving Highlights

Multicare Capital Medical (Washington): \$85,000

Supported the organization's Centering Pregnancy program that provides group prenatal care. Donated to its Helping Hands program, which helps patients with non-medical needs such as warm clothing, shoes, and car seats.

Dolly Parton Imagination Library (Oregon): \$50,000

Partnered with the Eugene Public Library Foundation to donate \$50,000 a year over five years to this well-known book-giving program that provides books, free of charge, to children from birth to age 5, regardless of income level.

North Thurston Public Schools (Washington): \$48,000

Helped support the district's One School, One Book program, provided student support and scholarships, and was a Partners in Education (PIE) partner.

Saint Martin's University (Washington): \$35,000

Sponsored various SMU fundraising events for student scholarships. Helped provide DEI training for SMU faculty in the 2022-23 school year.

Project Community Mini-Grants (Oregon): \$60,000

During our ninth year awarding these grants, 59 local K-12 schools received grants ranging from \$100 to \$1,500! These grants were used for a variety of purposes, including the purchase of new supplies & equipment and supporting school programs.

South Puget Sound Community College Foundation (Washington): \$26,500

The South Puget Sound Community College Foundation helps make college more accessible and affordable to students by awarding hundreds of scholarships and grants to SPSCC students.

Asia Pacific Cultural Center (Washington): \$15,500

Helped support the center's campaign for a new multi-use building, as well as various Asian Pacific Cultural Center program.

2023 DEI Highlights:

Partnering with the Spanish-Speaking **Community** (Washington): \$25,500

Provided \$10,000 to United Way of Lewis County to support its outreach programs for the Spanishspeaking community in rural Lewis County. Donated \$15,000 to sponsor local cultural celebrations and outreach programs. Provided financial education in Spanish for Support Group for Hope Alliance and DRC of Grays Harbor clients.

A Step Ahead Pierce **County** (Washington): \$10,000

Presenting sponsor for A Step Ahead Pierce County's (ASAPC) main fundraising event. ASAPC supports families of infants and toddlers with developmental delays or disability by enhancing their development and relationships both at home and in their community.

Grays Harbor Community College (Washington):

Every year, hundreds of adults and teenagers enroll in MoneyEdu, our self-directed online financial wellness education program, to increase their financial knowledge. Our members use interactive tools to create budgets, track spending, and calculate things such as how much interest they will pay when making minimum payments on credit cards.

Established in 2015, the TwinStar Community Foundation is the philanthropic arm of TwinStar Credit Union – and is committed to strengthening the communities it serves. While increasing financial literacy and reducing hunger in schools are the primary focuses of the foundation, it supports a wide range of causes and organizations. Credit Unions have a long and proud history of being involved in their communities – and foundations like the TwinStar Community Foundation help make a greater difference.

2023 TwinStar Community Foundation Highlights

Classroom Cash: \$33,127

Classroom Cash provided K-5 teachers, counselors, and librarians with grants that they could use to enhance their classrooms – from books to supplies to musical instruments.

All Kids Win: \$10,000

Provided food card certificates to students in need, so that they could buy food for themselves and their families during Thanksgiving break. All Kids Win is a Thurston County, Washington-based nonprofit that provides weekend food bags to middle and high school students.

Financial Literacy and Peer Tutoring: \$6,404

Funded peer tutoring programs at Avanti and Olympia high schools in Washington. Helped support Capital High School's (WA) financial literacy curriculum.

TOGETHER!: \$5,600

Our donation helped the Thurston County-Washington-based nonprofit organization provide after-school snacks for its Club House members.

Spanaway United Methodist Church: \$2,000

Partnered with the United Methodist Church in Spanaway, Washington to help two local families that have children with their move-in costs last year.

North Thurston School District: \$1,254

Donation paid off school lunch debt leftover from the COVID-19 Pandemic for students in the North Thurston School District in Washington.

Maui Wildfire Relief Efforts: \$100,000

Launched a campaign to support the communities affected by the Maui wildfires. All proceeds were donated to Maui Strong, Hawaii State Department of Education, and CUAid, all of which provided direct, on-the-ground support to those impacted by the wildfires.
